

Covid-19 Impacts on Construction

Covid-19 has left a lasting impact on the construction industry. Construction sites were directly affected by the pandemic, specially during the early days of the pandemic, due to the social distancing protocols and the unemployment benefits. The direct effects of COVID-19 created material and equipment delays, re-defined on-site safety protocols and company sick days. The COVID-19 test results policies varied daily by location.



Other challenges were faced by the construction industry due to the legislation passed into law during the early days of the pandemic. In Oklahoma, the CARES Act had the unintended consequence of disincentivizing construction workers from returning to the construction sites. An unemployed person could earn more than high earning employees at construction sites. Contractors had to give workers an increase of at least \$10 per hour per person to incentivize them to return to work. Manpower was difficult to find and to properly utilize, which made jobs take days longer than usual. On average, 26 additional hours were spent for every 40 hours of labor. Harper Construction reported that, on average, workers were given an increase in raises of 50% between March and June of 2020.


The COVID-19 Workplace

The pandemic has created many challenges for architect-engineering (A/E) firms. During the early days of the pandemic, most of the workers for A/E firms were expected to work from home. Additional computers, hardware, and software had to be acquired almost overnight to continue working on projects and meeting deadlines. Meetings could no longer be attended physically, which presented challenges when coordinating work to a team.



For Benham, communication was the key to continue their operations. The communication tools used by Benham included small group virtual meetings, phone calls to check in, asking for feedback and input, and digital social events. Digital social events helped connect workers from different

offices.



For Guy Engineering, communication and team morale were crucial to continue operations while keeping the office atmosphere. Daily virtual meetings were held to check up on coworkers and to keep everyone informed. Virtual games kept employees connected to boost morale.


Preparing for the CMMC



Professional Development

Tulsa Post Foundation Credentialing Program

The Tulsa Post has a Foundation Credentialing Program to promote the professional development of SAME members. The Foundation Board has established a budget for awards to make in 2020. Professional credentialing is a great way to enhance skills to perform better in the industry in which we serve.

The reimbursements are up to \$500 and the program is in place to help support professionals in advancing their careers through credentialing.

The program will support exam prep course, sitting or registration fee reimbursement for credentials, licensures, or certifications which are considered to have an intrinsic value to SAME's mission and the architectural and engineering professions.

- Initial application deadline is November 30, 2020.
- If there are more initial applications than funds available, the Foundation will rank the applications based on merit using the information in the applications.
- If the funds available are not used from the initial applications, additional applications will be accepted throughout the year and awarded in order of submittal and assuming the applications meet the program requirements. FY21 applications will be accepted until September 30, 2021, or until funds are used.
- Applicants must have taken and passed or plan to take and pass a credentialing exam between October 1, 2020 and September 30, 2021 to be eligible for FY21 reimbursement.
