Tulsa Post President's Letter By Anna Childers

Greetings Tulsa Post members and enthusiasts!

Tulsa Post is on track with our programs and continues to support the SAME national goal of enhancing Government-Industry Partnership. In June, the Tulsa Post conducted its third annual Oklahoma Contracting Opportunities Forum as a joint meeting with the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Tulsa Branch. At the meeting, USACE Tulsa District, the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, and the Oklahoma Military Department provided information about upcoming contracting opportunities with their organizations.

In addition to the Industry-Government Partnership goal, we are to develop Leaders for the Profession and Produce STEM Professionals for the Nation. To that end, Tulsa Post Board members, Rebecca Alvarez, Wade Anderson and Miro Kurka, participated the SAME National Post Leaders' Workshop (PLW) in Bonita Springs, FL in August. The focus of the PLW was on membership maintenance and development, build excitement for the SAME Centennial Celebration, and the transition of a national focused efforts to Post level. The Board continues to digest the takeaways and plan for the 2020 with the ideas from the PLW.

In August, Wade Anderson, USACE Tulsa, provided a presentation on Mosul Dam Task Force (MDTF) project. The dam is located on Tigris River in Iraq. The MDTF commemoration celebrating the completion the Project was held on June 15, 2019; the effort to stabilize the infrastructure of the Mosul Dam started in 2016 as a joint project among the Iraq Ministry of Water Resources, the USACE, and Italian Company Trevi S.p.A. The Dam, with a capacity of 3 trillion gallons of water, is the largest in Iraq and the fourth largest in the Middle East. It supplies water, hydropower, irrigation and flood control to the region.

I am excited to announce that Tulsa Post has submitted our Fellows nomination, Loretta Turner, Small Business Liaison of Tulsa Post, for the Class of 2020 of the SAME Academy of Fellows. The results will be provided by the end of the year. Fellows investiture will take place at JETC on May 29, 2020. Loretta has been an integral part of the SAME Tulsa Post for nearly 20 years and her continued efforts with SAME help secure the future success of this organization!

Also, we had the honor to hear presentations from three Tulsa Post-sponsored STEM Camp participants during our regular Board meeting in August. Savannah Asher, Kaylynn Cuningkin and Cameron Sparger gave short presentations of their experiences in the camps. It is such a joy to see the enthusiasm and professionalism of young future STEM leaders!

The rest of the year for Tulsa Post will be busy! We will discuss Cyber Security in September and conduct Resilience Workshop in October, focusing on the historic spring floods of Tulsa and the surrounding communities. Also, after working with the Oklahoma State University (OSU) staff and faculty this summer, I have been successful in scheduling AE and Construction Career Opportunities Student Session at OSU Stillwater Campus for November. We are very excited to take SAME on the road to meet future STEM professionals!

Finally, I would like to welcome COL Scott Preston, the new Commander and District Engineer of the Tulsa District to the SAME Tulsa Post! We are honored to have him as a new member!

The Run to 2020 & Beyond



As the Tulsa Post has tentatively scheduled the 2020 Meet the Corps for March 3-4, 2020 at the River Spirit Casino, it's interesting to look back at the history of the Industry-Army Day. Collaboration is essential today to solve any infrastructure-related challenge facing our nation's security. The Meet the Corps provides the avenue to facilitate this collaboration.

A LOOK BACK: FIRST SOUTHWEST REGION INDUSTRY-ARMY DAY, DALLAS, TX – 23 January 1948

The first Industry-Army Day conferences were proposed to the War Department by the editors of the Military Associations' publications. It was recommended that an Industry-Army conference be held to acquaint industrial leaders with military industrial mobilization plans and problems, and enlist the assistance of industry in military industrial planning. The first Industry-Army Day in the Southwest Region included eight hundred (800) industrial and military leaders! The list of distinguished guests included General Omar Bradley, Chief of Staff of the United States Army, General Thomas T. Handy, Commander of the Fourth Army, and Lt. General R.A. Wheeler, Chief of Engineers to only name a few.

Presentations followed by questions and answers by both industrial and military speakers which served to promote a mutual understanding of the problems presented by preparedness plans and programs in support of National Defense. Two additional Industry Day conferences preceded this event which were held in 1947 at Fort Lewis, Washington for the northwest and Omaha, Nebraska for the mid-west.

Event Review - August Lunch Program

The August 2019 lunch program presentation was on "Mosul Dam – Emergency Grouting and Bottom Outlet Repairs." Mosul Dam was considered one of the highest risk dams in the world due to deteriorating foundation conditions and both the life, economic, and water resource consequences should the dam fail. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in partnership with the Government of Iraq Ministry of Water Resources, led a Task Force consisting of USACE, AECOM, Versar, and Trevi to repair multiple components of the dam and complete over two years of drilling and grouting to stabilize the dam. The success of the Mosul Dam Task Force illustrates how technical, contractual, security, resource, and cultural challenges may be overcome with the coordination of governments, agencies, engineering and construction companies, and security forces.





About the Speaker:

Wade Anderson is the Chief, Engineering & Construction Division for Tulsa District as well as the Dam and Levee Safety Officer. Tulsa District is a full service district that own and operates 38 dams and services 6 military installations and one Department of Energy plant. Wade has over 29 years of experience with the Corps of Engineers (USACE) and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). Wade is the current Vice President of the SAME Tulsa Post and is an active member of the Association of State Dam Safety Officials and United States Society on Dams. Wade has both a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Civil Engineering from Oklahoma State University and is a registered professional engineer in both OK and TX. In 2018, Wade was requested by USACE HQ to deploy to Mosul Dam and serve as the USACE Dam Safety Officer through completion of the stabilization of Mosul Dam. Wade deployed to Mosul 3 times over the last 14 months and continued to provide dam engineering leadership while stateside.

Tulsa Post Foundation Credentialing Program

The Tulsa Post has a Foundation Credentialing Program to promote the professional development of SAME members. The Foundation Board has established a budget for awards to make in 2019. Professional credentialing is a great way to enhance skills to perform better in the industry in which we serve.

The reimbursements are up to \$500 and the program is in place to help support professionals in advancing their careers through credentialing.

The program will support exam prep course, sitting or registration fee reimbursement for credentials, licensures, or certifications which are considered to have an intrinsic value to SAME's mission and the architectural and engineering professions.

- Initial application deadline is May 1, 2019.
- If there are more initial applications than funds available, the Foundation will rank the applications based on merit using the information in the applications.
- If the funds available are not used from the initial applications, additional applications will be accepted throughout the year and awarded in order of submittal and assuming the applications meet the program requirements. **FY19 applications will be accepted until November 30, 2019, or until funds are used.**
- Applicants must have taken and passed or plan to take and pass a credentialing exam between October 1, 2018 and September 30, 2019 to be eligible for FY19 reimbursement.
